General Conference Information

Personal Rights and Privacy Policy

When attending Amputee Coalition events, you have the right to:

- Enjoy Amputee Coalition activities without interruption
- Be treated with respect
- Be free from inappropriate behavior
- Enjoy personal privacy
- Refuse having your picture or video taken
- Expect behavior violating this policy to stop when you first ask.

The Amputee Coalition has security in place for the National Conference. If you believe that your privacy or personal rights have been violated, you should notify an Amputee Coalition staff member immediately. The Amputee Coalition may then:

- Speak with the person whom you feel violated this policy
- Write a report describing the incident
- Notify the police
- Press charges
- Provide information and support if you press charges
- Penalize those in violation of this policy, which may include a ban from future Amputee Coalition events.





Suite Tower






